## **Kansas City Lawyer Honored During Law Day Ceremonies at MU**

COLUMBIA, Mo. – **Jack L. Campbell, Kansas City**, was recently honored with the Order of the Coif Honorary Initiate at the University of Missouri’s Law Day, an annual alumni and faculty awards ceremony hosted by the MU School of Law.

Campbell, who received a bachelor’s degree in political science from MU in 1967 and his law degree in 1970, has practiced law in Kansas City for 38 years. He currently practices with Polsinelli Shughart and concentrates his practice in labor and employment law. He was elected to the Missouri House of Representatives in 1981 and has served as a chief lobbyist for the City of Kansas City.

Campbell served as the chairman for the Young Lawyers Section of The Missouri Bar in 1977; served on the MU Law School Foundation board of trustees since 1987 and is a member of The Law Society and Jefferson Club. He is also the co-chair for a campaign to raise \$1 million for the Kansas City Bar Association to move to a new headquarters for the first time in 20 years.

Campbell is married to MU alumna Marsha Campbell, whom he met while in law school, and who is a former member of the Missouri General Assembly. They currently reside in Kansas City.
